As indicated by the former Minister of Social and Family Development, Mr Tan Chuan Jin, "Singapore's Gini coefficient which stands at 0.458 in 2016 is amongst the highest in developed countries, suggesting that the rich-poor gap is an area of concern with some children from poor families finding it tough to move out of the poverty trap."

In the last 22 years, Life Community Services Society remain focused on reaching out to the community with a mission of empowering children and families through care and mentoring. Collectively, the five core programs, namely, Friends of Children & Youth, MightyKids, Families and Community, Life Student Care, and EduGrow for Brighter Tomorrows serves over 980 children/ youth and 450 caregivers. In tandem with our mission and the government's direction to tackle social challenges upstream, Life Community was appointed a partner agency of the Early Childhood Development Agency (ECDA) to pilot the KidSTART program. This program brought us deeper engagements in the grounds of Geylang Serai and Kreta Ayer pilot region. We are honoured to play a part as a community partner to harness the strengths of the families by reaching out








SUCCESS STORY - CASE STUDY

*Irene was only 7 years old when she saw her mother for the first time in 2015 when Irene's father brought her home to consume drugs in the house together. Unfortunately, the reunion was short-lived as her mother was arrested by the CNB in 2015.

Despite the short time with her mother, Irene had become attached to her mother, and her only wish was for her mother to be there for her when she feels sad.

Before her father was released from prison in 2014, Irene could only see her father when her aunt brought her and her brothers along for visits to her father in prison. Even after his release, he was uninvolved and still relied on Irene's maternal aunts and grandmother to take care of his children. In 2016, he left the house to start another family of his own and shortly after, in Feb 2017, he was arrested for falling back into his drug consumption habits.

With both parents only released in 2020 and 2024 respectively, the responsibility of caring of Irene and her two brothers fell back onto her maternal aunt and grandmother.

Irene joined the Friends of Children and Youth (FOCY) programme in October 2015. A caseworker from Life Community visited Irene regularly, providing her with care and emotional support. Irene could confide in her caseworker about the challenges she faced. The caseworker journeyed together with Irene through her highs and lows.

Irene also joined the Dance Interest Group under Life Community in 2016, and through it, made many new friends and was given many opportunities to perform together with the dance group at Life Community's events. With each performance, Irene grew in confidence and gained higher self-esteem.

A befriender was attached to Irene to play the role of a mentor and friend. Apart from meeting her regularly, bringing her to different places such as the library, park and shopping malls, she also lends a listening ear to Irene, providing Irene with further social, emotional and academic support. Irene's

befriender even went the extra mile and suggested for Irene to receive tuition services provided by her church.

Through her caseworker's support and counselling with the aim to ensure that Irene be more resilient to life, Irene no longer has any bitter or angry feelings towards her father for leaving the family. Her pure heart still believes that her parents are good people and now, Irene is patiently counting down to the day of her mother's release to be reunited with her again. In the meantime, Life Community will continue to walk hand in hand with Irene and the family to provide holistic support in whatever way possible.





EDUGROW FOR BRIGHTER TOMORROWS

EduGrow for Brighter Tomorrows is a family-centric, early intervention pilot initiated as a partnership with WeCare@MarineParade. It is targeted at Kindergarten 2 to Secondary 1 children from lower-income families residing in Marine Parade.

EduGrow aims to enable these children to be on a path of upward social mobility, by building on their Aspirations, Character, Education, Financial Values & Relational Skills.


















*Minghao is an 11-year-old boy who has been with EduGrow since 2017. He lives with his immediate and extended family in a rental unit. Minghao has a slight stutter which resulted in low self-esteem. His parents were on the verge of divorce due to domestic violence which further affected him emotionally.

EduGrow has been supporting Minghao academically through group academic coaching in English and Mathematics, and even provided a volunteer to teach him skills to cope with his stutter. EduGrow also introduced a mentor to Minghao who would visit him weekly without fail. The mentor was able to help Minghao process his family situation and understand the issues surrounding his parents' relationship.

Thanks to the dedication and support from the EduGrow staff and volunteers, Minghao is now better able to cope with his stutter, and has shown improvements in his academic performance. He continues to enjoy a positive relationship

with his parents and understands the difficulties they face in their husband-wife relationship.

While it is heartening to see Minghao progress, he still has a long road ahead of him. Minghao continues to struggle with English and Mathematics. The tutors, volunteer mentor, and staff will continue to support him emotionally and academically.

"It has been a privilege to Join Edugrow for Brighter Tomorrows community, ably administered by the wonderful team at Life Community & WeCare@MarineParade.

They say life is a race, and it's great to have the chance to help walk a little bit of the way with these young ones, and hopefully share with them some experience and tools to help them run their race.

It will take time to bear fruit, but I'm glad the Edugrow team has helped us get started. Hopefully we will continue to make that little bit of difference."



KIDSTART

KidSTART is a pilot programme led by the Early Childhood Development Agency (ECDA) to enable children from low-income families to have a good start in life.

LCSS steers coordination work for one of the key programme components, KidSTART Groups, for children aged 1-3 and their caregivers in Kreta Ayer/Bukit Merah and Geylang Serai areas. Our role is to conduct initial outreach to families and also provide support to facilitators and families on the ground as well as at parent experiential and family excursions.

KidSTART Groups are weekly communitybased sessions led by trained facilitators and are aimed at enhancing parent-child interactions and child development outcomes. These are based on the
