Steven, an engineer by profession, shares with us his journey as a volunteer tutor with Life Community.

"I was introduced to Fabien* in 2012. I met up with him weekly. Initially, I wanted to help with science or math. However, after the first few meetings, I realized that he needed help for ALL his subjects. The greatest challenge for me was that Fabien did not have a foundation from which I could work up from. I had to lay this foundation.

Fabien had missed a great deal of education in his initial years due to his family situation. He only started formal education at the age of 12. He entered school at the Primary 4 level, having to mix with children 2 years younger than him. This gave Fabien the time and an opportunity to catch up before attempting the Primary School Leaving Examinations (PSLE).

Despite coming from a dysfunctional family, Fabien has always been optimistic and cheerful, which is the most memorable part in working with him. He never blamed anyone for his circumstances. He chose to remain forward-looking. Whenever possible, he also extends a helping hand to his classmates and friends.

Fabien's lack in life did not stop him from progressing. The road has been a steep incline for him. He is constantly challenged to put in more effort into his study especially with secondary school syllabi being much harder."

At age 14, Fabien attempted his PSLE. To everyone's delight, Fabien, who could barely read or write at age 12, passed his PSLE. Fabien now has a much brighter future ahead of him because of the guidance and support that Steven and other volunteers have provided him and his family over the years.



Abandoned

Shane's father was incarcerated for illegal money lending. His mother left him in the care of his paternal grandmother and they are in the process of a divorce. Since his release, Shane's father has had a new girlfriend, and is planning to start a family with her. Shane's grandfather is currently incarcerated on drug-related offences.

8 year old Shane is living in a rental flat with his grandmother who works as a cleaner. She suffers from high-blood pressure and experiences pain in her legs and hands. Shane's grandmother is dependent on medication in order to continue working to provide for Shane. She is financially burdened with her health issues.



Shane and his grandmother rely on financial assistance to get by. Life Community provides food ration to alleviate some of the financial stress. Shane struggles emotionally. He misses his parents and wonders why they don't visit him. We are also working with Shane with issues of abandonment and the vulnerability of losing his grandmother. Work with Shane is a long journey. Life Community needs your support to continue to support Shane emotionally, educationally and socially as he matures and not 'abandon' Shane in his circumstances.
