For all their services rendered, we are glad for the incidental benefits LCSS can value-add to the lives of our befrienders and clients.

We had our Annual Staff Retreat in July at The Bottle Tree Park. Staff and Board Members had a great time catching up with one another. With our spirits refreshed and renewed, we are ready to better serve in the community.

A Heart warming story...

*John is a 16 year-old teenage boy. His father has been incarcerated since he was 14 years old. He started to display delinquent behavior, such as irregular attendance at school, insubordination, underage smoking, tattooing and stealing. He was eventually suspended from school. He was very indifferent during our staff's visits and would frequently miss his appointment with us. He has also kept our staff waiting hours for him.

Staff worked with the school authority. However, John refused to abide by the school's rules. His delinquent behavior continued to escalate until he was caught for stealing a bicycle. He was then sent to the Boys' Home for a month, thereafter, a year in Boys' Hostel, followed by several months of probation.

Despite no initial, visible change, staff persevered with John. A turning point came when he ran away from the Boy's Hostel. One weekend, he came down with a high fever and decided to call our staff for help. Our staff, Reuben, set aside his weekend plans and brought him to the doctor, offered him a meal and sent him back to the Boy's Hostel.

John is now on probation. He has since begun to take some positive steps. Now, John is in the midst of his 'N' level examinations. He studies on his own and is motivated to do well in his exams. With persistence and hope, our staff pressed on despite the many discouraging events. If not for our staff's determination, compassion and passion to touch lives, John's delinquent behavior could have escalated. He is now more responsive to our staff and has not missed any appointment.


Donors, Volunteers & Staff Appreciation Dinner 2010




